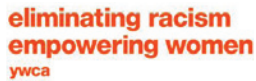

**CRITERIA**

Nominees may be living or deceased and must have lived in Alaska at some point in her life. If a nominee is living, she must be at least 65 years of age as of Nov.1, 2010. A nominee's contributions should be of community, state-wide or of national importance and of enduring value.

**TIMETABLE FOR SUBMISSION**

For the 2011 nominations, applications must be received by November 1, 2010. Nominations will be reviewed and considered for selection by a panel of judges. Honorees will be selected and their names will be posted in March 2011 to coincide with National Womens History Month.
